- P: Our God is a mighty God who has the power to crush armies and rain down fire and brimstone:
- C: But when he came down to earth he came as a humble little child.
- P: Today we face the mystery of how Jesus can be both God and man at the same time:
- C: Lord, give us a child-like faith to believe that Jesus is both God and man.
- P: Lord, as we ponder the meaning of the lowly manger and see the baby Jesus lying there,
- C: Help us to see and believe that he lies there as our God and Savior. While we look back at the manger, help us also to look ahead to heaven where we will be with Jesus.
- P: On this day of Christmas fill our hearts again with appreciation for this great truth of the Bible:
- C: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Confession & Absolution

P: Sisters and brothers in Christ: there was a time when the world sat in darkness, separated from God because of sin. Since we human beings were unable to find God in that darkness, he came to us as a baby, born of a virgin, bringing with him the great light of our salvation. Come near to God, open your hearts to him, and confess to him your sins.

Silence for personal reflection and confession

- P: Heavenly Father,
- C: We confess that we have sinned against you in our thoughts, words, and deeds. The world has tempted us in this Christmas season to put our delight and joy in material things, to be envious of others, and to center our celebrations around ourselves rather than on you. As a result, we have sinned against you and against one another.
- P: The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
- C: The celebration you desire is the worship of the heart. Forgive our sins, O Lord, for the sake of the one born in Bethlehem, Jesus Christ, who died for our sins. Decorate our hearts with repentance and joy that our Christmas celebration may be pleasing to you.

P: This Child whose birth we celebrate came among us to live perfectly in our place, to give his life in payment for our sins, to rise from the grave for our justification, and to give us new life. In his name and at his command, I as a called and ordained servant of the Word, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the & Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Gospel John 1:1-18

- P: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.
- C: Through him everything was made, and without him not one thing was made that has been made.
- P: In him was life, and the life was the light of mankind.
- C: The light is shining in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
- P: There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light.
- C: The real light that shines on everyone was coming into the world.
- P: He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not recognize him.
- C: He came to what was his own, yet his own people did not accept him.
- P: But to all who did receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. They were born, not of blood, or of the desire of the flesh, or of a husband's will, but born of God.
- C: The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. We have seen his glory, the glory he has as the only-begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- P: John testified about him. He cried out, "This was the one I spoke about when I said, 'The one coming after me outranks me because he existed before me."
- C: For out of his fullness we have all received grace upon grace.
- P: For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

C: No one has ever seen God. The only-begotten Son, who is close to the Father's side, has made him known.


