

Luke 11:1–13 <sup>1</sup> On another occasion, Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John also taught his disciples."

<sup>2</sup> He said to them, "When you pray, say, 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. <sup>3</sup> Give us each day our daily bread. <sup>4</sup> Forgive us our sins, as we also forgive everyone who sins against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

<sup>5</sup> He said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and tell him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, <sup>6</sup> because a friend of mine who is on a journey has come to me, and I do not have anything to set before him.' 7 And the one inside replies, 'Don't bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give it to you.' 8 I tell you, even if he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his bold persistence, he will get up and give him as much as he needs.

<sup>9</sup> "I tell you, keep asking, and it will be given to you. Keep seeking, and you will find. Keep knocking, and it will be opened to you. <sup>10</sup> For everyone who asks receives. The one who seeks finds. And to the one who knocks, it will be opened.

<sup>11</sup> "What father among you, if your son asks for bread, would give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, would give him a snake instead of a fish? <sup>12</sup> Or if he asks for an egg, would give him a scorpion? <sup>13</sup> If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Luke 11:1-13

Jesus Invites You to the Conversation

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,

who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

# Lord's Prayer (responsively)

- P: I invite you to lift up your hearts to God and pray with me the Lord's Prayer as Christ our Lord taught us.
- P: First, we pray that God our Father in heaven would look with mercy on all his children on earth. We ask him to give us grace that we might proclaim his Word faithfully and live our lives according to his will, for then we show that his name is


precious to us. We also pray that he would keep us from any teaching and living which would dishonor his name.

- C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.
- P: We pray that his kingdom and the rule of his grace might come to us and grow in us each day; that all who are still captives in Satan's kingdom might be brought to know Jesus Christ, his Son, so that the Christian Church might grow and prosper.
- C: Thy kingdom come.
- P: We pray that the Holy Spirit would strengthen us to do and accept God's will in life and death, in good times and in bad, and that we might have power to put down our own sinful will and its desires.
- C: Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
- P: We pray that our Father would also give us our daily bread, preserve us from greed and selfish desires, and help us to trust that he will provide for all our needs.
- C: Give us this day our daily bread.
- P: We ask that God would forgive our sins as we forgive those who sin against us so that our hearts may rest and rejoice in a good conscience before him, and that no sin may ever frighten or alarm us.
- C: And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.
- P: We pray that God would protect us from all temptations and help us by his Spirit to put down our sinful flesh, to despise the world and its vices, and to overcome the devil and all his trickery.
- C: And lead us not into temptation.
- P: And finally, we pray that God would deliver us from all evils of body and soul now and forever.
- C: But deliver us from evil.
- P: All those who sincerely desire these things will say from their hearts "Amen," trusting without doubt that their prayers are answered in heaven, as Christ has promised: "Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours."
- C: For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

- By his rising from the grave, he opened heaven.




# Words of Institution (Pastor)

The peace of the Lord be with you always. **C: Amen.** 







