#### **CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION**

- M: God invites us to come into his presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask him to forgive us.
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.



The words of the invocation are the words used in Baptism. They intentionally remind us that our relationship with God is secure because of his grace.



Jesus authorized us to speak these words of forgiveness on his behalf. Hear them as Jesus speaking to you!



The word Kyrie is a Greek word from the phrase Kyrie eleison which means. "Lord. have mercy!" It is not a cry for forgiveness, but a plea that our Lord hear us and help us in our necessities and trouble. Christians have been praying the Kyrie at Sunday worship for more than 1700 years.

M: Merciful God, maker and preserver of life, uphold us by your power and keep us in your tender care:




M: The works of the Lord are great and glorious; his name is worthy of praise.

#### **FIRST LESSON**

**N**ow Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up. So Moses thought, "I will go over and see this strange sight—why the bush does not burn up."

When the LORD saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!"

And Moses said, "Here I am."

"Do not come any closer," God said. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." Then he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob." At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God.

The LORD said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."

But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?"

And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain."



The Lord promised Moses that he would be with Moses as Moses carried out the work of leading the Israelites out of slavery. Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"


God said to Moses, "I AM who I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'"



SERMON

Matthew 9:9-13

How Do We Want to Be Remembered?



Jesus called a most unlikely disciple, reminding us that there is grace for everyone.









This ancient creed summarizes what the Bible teaches us about God. In particular, this creed reminds us what God did in the past and continues to do in the present in order to save and bless us.

#### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

C: We believe in one God the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

#### THE SACRAMENT





M: The peace of the Lord be with you always.






In Isaiah 6 we read that angelic choirs sing "Holy, Holy, Holy" to God in heaven. They do this to worship the perfect and holy God. While we do not see him with our eyes, in the Lord's Supper, God is present as we receive Jesus' body and blood. It is most fitting for us to praise the God who has saved us, using the heavenly song.



This ancient song text is based on John the Baptist's proclamation that Jesus is "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). The simple words remind us of the heavenly blessing we receive in the Lord's Supper.



On pages 295-296 in the hymnal you will find "Christian Questions" to help you prepare for the Lord's Supper.


